

EHS - CLASS OF 1967 MEETING  
September 12, 2006

The meeting of the 40-year Reunion Committee was called to order by Steve Peterson at Buck's Restaurant at approximately 6:45 p.m. Those in attendance besides Steve Peterson were: Bill Tackitt, Bill Hughes, John Moser, Dave Dorsey, Ken Carmen, Susie Peterson, Kathy Stewart Romstad, Cathy Voie Eisenman, Annette Kerber, and Jeep Carpenter.

I. The Minutes from the May 20<sup>th</sup> Meeting

The Minutes taken by Dawn Carter were approved.

II. Financial Repor

Steve gave a financial report indicating that there was \$2,300 in the bank which included a \$1,000 deposit Ken Carmen had maintained/saved since the last reunion. Also, it was noted that \$1,500 of the \$2,300 represented a gift from Dallas Salisbury who wanted to make sure he contributed since he will not be able to make the planning meetings because he lives in Washington, D.C. The balance also included \$100 payments from nine individuals on the committee who had agreed to prepay for their tickets. Steve confirmed that a \$1,000 deposit, which is nonrefundable, was made to the Hilton at Paine Field to reserve the room for the reunion.

The additional people in attendance were all asked to make a \$100 contribution which would basically mean they have prepaid for their ticket to the event. This will insure we have sufficient funds to pay for costs of the event.

III. Venue

Next a discussion with regard to the Hilton took place. As indicated above, we are somewhat stuck with the Hilton although everyone agrees it should be a good place to hold the reunion. Also the Hilton had some rooms set aside (20) at a good price of \$109 per night.

IV. Report on Finding Individuals

Bill Hughes reported on the website and the work he had done (and he has done a lot of work) in creating a list of classmates with email addresses. He also had broken down the list into groups of 20 and each person present took a list of 20 people with the goal of seeing if they could locate addresses for each person.

As of the date of the meeting, 65 of the 545 class members had been contacted. We had learned that 32 of the 545 were deceased. Bill, through his efforts, had determined addresses for 264 individuals but reported that 184 people were missing.

V. Entertainment

Steven Juntala was not present so entertainment was tabled until the next meeting, although a brief discussion took place about having the Jazz group from Everett High perform or play background music at the event. Again the group discussed the option of some speeches and/or speakers. This idea was not real popular in that everyone felt it would be difficult for people to focus on a speaker. Tackitt volunteered to lead the fight song in that he does not have an email address.

Also, the idea of a band and/or dancing was discussed. People were thinking that with XM Radio we might be able to get by without a DJ. This needs to be explored. Also, the idea of putting together a video of old pictures was discussed. Everyone agreed this would be a good idea and Jeep said he would contact Phil LaGrand (sp), an EHS graduate who operates his own video business and has done video's for graduations, homecoming and reunions.

#### VI. Advertising "Notifying People".

The real goal is how do we get the word out to other classmates regarding the reunion? Do we spend any money on advertising? We can probably get some help from the Herald, but not until much, much closer to the event.

Everyone was then asked to bring at least one new person to the next meeting and go through their list and try to locate individuals. It was decided the next meeting would be November 7<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at Bucks.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
